

I will miss you - and especially this great weekend. So my prayers are with you in a special way hoping you will have a superb time, and that this weekend brings you a 'Change of Heart'.



Half of our London Weekend offering is going to the Methodist Association of Youth Fellowships in Sierra Leone, West Africa. In 1985 and 1986, the country went through a severe economic decline coupled with fuel shortages and high inflation rates. This affected all aspects of the Church's life there and delayed progress in co-ordinating the youth work. However, in April 1987 MAYF was set up and they are holding their first national meeting in September 1988.

Plans are being made to hold national events, using drama, sport, culture and Bible quizzes. It is hoped to organise workcamps in each District and carry out urgent repairs to Methodist Primary Schools, in which MAYF members will be fully involved. "Forming MAYF is an important milestone in the life of the young Church in our country..."

The other half will help to support young volunteers in Youth Ministry Teams and Christians in Action Projects, to help them serve others and develop themselves. If you would like to volunteer, write to Clive Marsh at MAYC for details.


If you go down to Battersea Park ... you're sure of a big noise!
